# In numbers

**18,400** newly arrived Burundian refugees

**10,800** host family members in **2,469** households

4 provinces affected

#### Highlights

- Due to ongoing political unrest in Burundi, thousands are fleeing into neighbouring countries.
- As of 8 November close to 18,400 Burundian refugees have been registered in DRC.

### Situation Update

- The majority of refugees, almost 17,000 are residing in South Kivu.
- Approximately 10,500 of these refugees are residing in the Lusenda camp and approximately 6,000 are living with host families. A small number are in transit centres and other temporary sites.
- In addition, around 1,600 refugees are residing in the North Kivu, Katanga and Maniema provinces.
- Biometric registration of refugees in South Kivu shows that 52% are female/girls and 48% are male/ boys. Out of the total 60% are children under 18 years old, and over 48% are under 12 years old.

### WFP Response

#### Food Assistance

- WFP is cooperating closely with UNHCR and partner NGOs for distributions.
- Food rations were previously distributed, but as of end of October assistance will be provided through vouchers to the majority of refugees.
- Each voucher is worth USD \$ 23 and is designated for food purchase. The value is calculated on the value of a 45-day food basket.
- The use of vouchers contributes to developing and stimulating local markets, and allows the affected population to purchase their preferred foods.

### Clusters

#### Logistics Cluster

- One mobile storage unit and 5 MT of High Energy Biscuits have been positioned in Uvira for immediate response.
- Provision of one mobile storage unit in Lusenda/ Fizi to support humanitarian partners Rebuild Hope for Africa and UNWomen.

## Partnerships

- UNHCR and OCHA are leading the response with support from WFP.
- Partner NGOs African Initiative for Relief and Development (AIRD), World Vision and Caritas are delivering assistance as well as nutrition supplements to refugees and host families.

## Resourcing Update

• WFP budget requirements to answer the food needs of the Burundian refugees for 2016 amounts to approximately USD \$ 11 million.
