NATURE OF THE INCREASE

1. This Budget revision will extend the project in time until 30 July 2017 to complete the distribution of food to beneficiaries and repay the loans taken during the operation.

JUSTIFICATION FOR THE REVISION

- 2. The emergency response to hurricane Matthew started with the distribution of food commodities borrowed from the Cuba Country Programme (CP 200703). These commodities were, however, insufficient to cover the needs of the targeted populations.
- 3. The procurement of the additional commodities required suffered significant delays due to lack of funding, complex international procurement processes as well as delays by the supplier in delivering commodities. As a result, the distribution of food assistance to the affected populations, as well as the repayment of the loan from the country programme had to be delayed.
- 4. WFP could eventually borrow commodities from the Government in order to expedite the distribution of food commodities to the targeted populations. However, not all commodities of the planned food basket were available for a loan. In the case of vegetable oil, the distribution could only start once the procured commodity was received in country inmid-March 2017.
- 5. Therefore, a Budget Revision has become necessary to repay the loans taken from the CP and the Government.
- 6. No budget increase is needed given that all commodities have already been purchased and internal transport costs are covered by the government counterpart. The DSC available is sufficient to cover the costs for the monitoring of the final distributions and loan repayment during the extension period. There is no change in the number of beneficiaries and food requirements of the operation.
