



## Country: South Sudan

### Highlights

- Update on 15 trucks impounded in Yei.** The trucks remain in Yei, detained there since 25 May. WFP continues its efforts to secure their return to Juba. A 16th truck was left in Mundri in the course of fighting there on 22 May because keys went missing. Authorities have given WFP permission to send a recovery mission to Mundri, which will take place this weekend.
- Arrival of WFP South Sudan's new Deputy Country Director (Support Services).** This week, Maria Bautista-Owen arrived in Juba to officially assume her role as the DCD of Support Services.
- WFP reaches more than 1.3 million people in the month of May.** Under its Emergency Operation (EMOP), WFP reached about 518,000 people with a emergency unconditional food distributions and nutritional support. Through its Protracted Relief and Recovery Operation (PRRO), WFP served over 784,000 people through a combination of unconditional and conditional food distributions and supplementary nutrition feeding.
- SCOPE launch next week in Mingkaman.** On 15 June, WFP will be launching its SCOPE e-vouchers in Mingkaman. Assistance through vouchers allows beneficiaries greater choice, helps stimulate markets and relieves the demand for in-kind food, ensuring that locations without reliable markets can be prioritized. The e-vouchers, which are biometrically protected and safer than paper vouchers, will be distributed to more than 15,000 households (over 70,000 people). - Resilience Context Analysis workshop in Juba next week.** Under the leadership of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry, Rural Development and Cooperatives, a consultative technical workshop on South Sudan's Resilience Context Analysis will be held in Juba, 16-17 June. Agencies including WFP, FAO, UNICEF, OCHA, UNDP, UN Women and WHO as well as international institutions, the World Bank and FEWSNET will collaborate in the comprehensive discussions aimed at creating a common understanding of resilience to specific outcomes in country. This will be a critical base on which to build effective partnerships and a framework from which resilience-enhancing operations can be designed in a more cohesive, systematic and strategic manner, based on strong evidence based programming.

### In numbers

- 1.5 million** IDPs (OCHA estimates)
- 552,000** displaced outside South Sudan (UNHCR estimates)
- 137,100** seeking shelter with the UN (UNMISS estimates)
- 4.6 million** projected to remain in emergency or crisis level food insecurity from May to July 2015 (IPC, May 2015)

### WFP Response

#### Food and Nutrition Assistance

- WFP and Cooperating Partners' teams completed distributions in Pagil and Lankien (Jonglei).
- Teams are currently deployed in Nyanapol, Chuil, Ayueldit, Pading, Menime, Haat (Jonglei) and Gum (Upper Nile).
- Next deployments are planned for Kandak, Walgak, Akobo (Jonglei), Abiemnhom (Unity), Maiwut and Pagak (Upper Nile).

**Logistics** 

- UNMISS will provide road patrols for Juba-Mvolo and Wau-Bentiu road stretches as mitigation measure against similar incidents. Movement resumed on 08 June.
- Malakal airport is operational again. Logistics in Juba has arranged for an air bridge to commence deliveries for the urgently needed food assistance to Malakal.
- WFP is also seeking necessary clearances for movement of barges from Bor to Malakal next week.
- The 16th road convoy from Kosti, Sudan to Melut is still on hold until the situation allows for delivery. WFP continues to explore other options for transshipment.
- Since 1 January 2015, WFP has dispatched 140,229 mt of food commodities, of which a total of 24,431 mt has been airlifted or airdropped within South Sudan and from Ethiopia.

**Special Operations**

**Food Security and Livelihoods Cluster**



- Food Security and Livelihoods Cluster partners have reached 930 households in Central Equatoria with emergency crop kits. Additionally, over 2,000 households in Jonglei (Fangak and Bor South) were reached with crop, vegetable and fishing kits. FSL Cluster partners also reached 2,500 households with crop kits in Mayom county, Unity last week.
- In line with the emergency response, FSL cluster partners launched an Input Trade Fair (ITF) in Northern Bahr el Ghazal with over 20,000 participants involved over the past week.
- Over the past week, FSL cluster partner concluded a baseline survey on the Fuel Efficient Stove (FES) project. FSL cluster partners have distributed over 10,000 FES to vulnerable IDP households, thus minimizing the pressure of sudden increased populations on natural resources as well as reducing the burden of collecting firewood (and associated risks of exposure to gender-based violence).
- Abyei region livestock vaccinations are ongoing by FSL Cluster partners.

**Logistics Cluster**



- The Logistics Cluster airlifted 115 mt on behalf of ten partners to Boma, Lankien, Makak, Malakal, Mathiang, Nyal, Pibor and Rumbek.
- In order to streamline use of common logistics assets, priority locations are determined by the Operational Working Group and endorsed by the Inter-Cluster Working Group. This week's priority is the Nyal island survival kit distribution which will last until 15 June.
- The Logistics Cluster continues to facilitate the distribution of 'survival kits' to southern Unity and has delivered 26 mt to date with the Mi-8 helicopter.
- Flights resumed to Malakal this week, but were briefly suspended due to a security incident.
- The loading in Bor of the Malakal bound barge is due to begin soon and is expected to take two weeks to complete.

- With the onset of the rainy season, physical access continues to deteriorate throughout the country. **Emergency Telecommunications Cluster (ETC)**



- In Malakal, a mission to improve the security telecommunications network coverage is ongoing. A new radio repeater will be installed and several maintenance activities completed. Comprehensive radio training will be organized as well.
- In Yida, a mission is planned to restore Internet connectivity, which has been unstable for the past two weeks.

**UN Humanitarian Air Service**



- UNHAS transported 1,891 passengers and 27.9 mt of light cargo during the reporting period. Cargo transported was more than 50 percent compared to the previous week due to increased requests, including the movement of 10.3 mt of medical supplies to Rubkona on behalf of UNICEF.
- During the week, 64 passengers were affected by flight cancellations mainly due to wet airstrips.
- Two medical evacuations were performed out of Yida and Aweil for UNHCR and Crown Agent, while five children were reunified with their families from Jikmir and Bor to Juba and from Juba to Waat.
- On behalf of UNHCR, UNHAS facilitated the return of two refugees to Maban after undergoing medical treatment in Juba and the relocation of 14 dependents of UNHCR staff out of Rubkona.
- UNHAS facilitated 14 special missions during the reporting period including: WFP/Cooperating partners' Rapid Response Mobile team deployments to Makak, Chuil, Ayueldit, Pagil, Jikmir, Menime, Gum, Jiech, Rieng, Haat and Pading; UNICEF's special mission to Mingkaman and a mission for the Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Disaster Management to Paloich and Renk.

**Feeder Roads**



- WFP continues to closely monitor the security situation in Western Equatoria. The Contractor staff has returned to site and the situation is reported as relatively safe. The WFP Engineer is expected to return to site next week, depending on the situation.
- The Netherlands has granted approval for the construction of the Ame-Ame Juba junction road stretch. De-mining is in progress.
- Works in Eastern and Central Equatoria are progressing as planned; and several procurement activities are underway for various roads projects.
