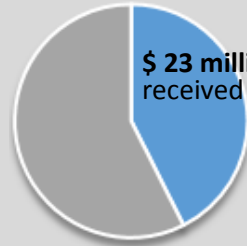

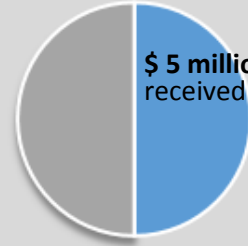

Situation Update

- On **4 October**, Haiti was hit by a **category 4 Hurricane**. Initial reports revealed that over 175,000 people were displaced and nearly 550 had died.
- The **movement of commodities** for humanitarian assistance is rapidly going back to a higher pace after the **elections** as shown in the below graph. Preliminary results have been published and the security constraints remain due to demonstrations and tensions among the population.

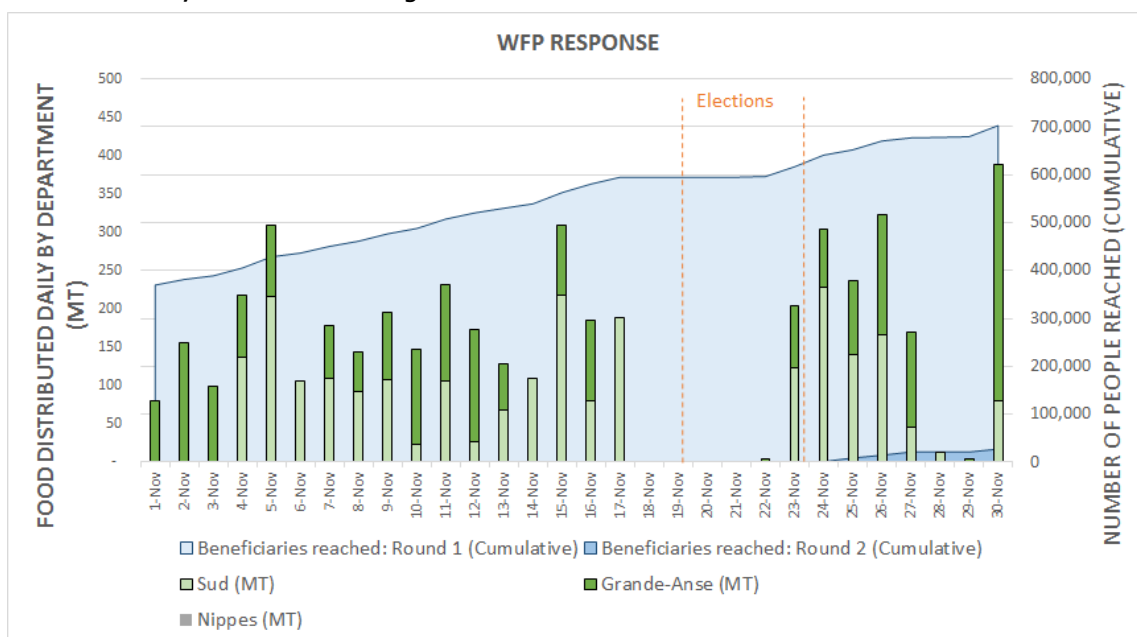
6 and 59 months (BSF). Over the last week, High Energy Biscuits (HEB) have also been airlifted to hard to reach areas to complement the ration distributed.

- **Protection trainings** for partners involved in distributions are ongoing in the field. At the same time WFP is implementing a **beneficiaries feedback** mechanism.
- Registration of beneficiaries for **cash transfers** is ongoing in 2 of the 7 communes targeted by WFP. Distributions are supposed to start in the second week of December.
- WFP, in partnership with CNSA, FAO and Fews Net, has started preparatory activities for the **in-depth EFSA** that is expected to be completed by the end of January 2017 and will assess the impact of the hurricane on food availability, access to food and livelihoods in general.



WFP Response

- Between 7 October and 1 December, WFP **reached 715,000 people** and distributed a total of **7,800mt of food**. Supplementary feeding has been distributed to **3,130 children** aged between



Logistics Working Group

- The **new WFP chartered vessel** completed its first rotation and arrived in Anse D’Hainault on Saturday, 26 November around 14h00 local time. The Logistics Working Group facilitated the discharge of more than 400mt of food and NFIs transported on behalf of WFP and ACTED; the offload started on Saturday afternoon and was completed on Wednesday, 30 November. The barge is already back in Port-au-Prince and equipped to start the loading for the **second rotation**, supposed to take place on Sunday, 4 December, with planned destination Anse D’ Hainault, Grande Anse department.
- On 26 November the Logistics Working Group facilitated the delivery of 7 trucks (25mt/145m³) with **shelter items and family kits on behalf of IFRC** to be distributed in Chambellan.

ICT Working Group

- As **national Internet services providers** are now available in Les Cayes and Jeremie, the ETC is now starting the process of recovering its services in these areas. In Jeremie there will be an ETC presence at the COUD with a tent to be setup as a common work space, as well as in the current IHP camp. NGOs that are currently using a dedicated ETC link to their office should be migrating to a



national internet service provider before 1 January 2017, after which the ETC will start to recover their equipment. In Les Cayes the ETC service will continue to be available at the logistics base and the COUD, and will be removed from MINUSTAH.

Resourcing

- So far, the shortfall for the Protracted Relief and Recovery Operation amounts to 48%. **USD 25 million are still urgently required** to meet the food needs of the targeted 800,000 beneficiaries.
- The SO, launched for logistics and telecommunication augmentation and coordination, is currently 50% funded and **WFP needs USD 5 million** to continue efforts providing vital logistics and telecommunications support.
