Dperational Constraints

• The security situation remains volatile in parts of North-East Nigeria, coupled with restricted road access during the rainy season; three LGAs in Borno State (Abadam, Marte and Guzamala) are still considered completely inaccessible, all of which are in Emergency (IPC 4).

• Possible loss of access to Hudaydah Port, where 70% of commercial and humanitarian imports arrive, could affect access to food for more than 5.1 million WFP beneficiaries

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Overview:

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


1.4 m children are severely malnourished 600,000 of which are at immediate risk of death in the coming months

- US\$699m needed by WFP for the next six months 2.8bn total 2017 requirement
- Up from 6m people assisted by WFP in September

Scaling up to prevent and respond to Famine requires:

- **Sustained funding** for a sustained response
- Humanitarian access to all affected areas
- An integrated response with all partners

🖬 What is Famine?

According to IPC, Famine is declared when an area:

1.) Has at least 20% of households facing an extreme lack of food;

2.) 30% of the children are suffering from acute malnutrition, and;

3.) 1 person for every 5,000 dies each day from starvation. (Source: IPC)
