Highlights

- The fourth corridor for delivery of humanitarian assistance from Sudan to South Sudan is open. The first WFP convoy is currently on its way from El-Obeid to Aweil.
- WFP and partners assisted 16,700 people in Baggari, Western Bahr El Ghazal, where people face Humanitarian Catastrophe (IPC Phase 5) food insecurity levels.
- WFP completed School Meals baseline assessment and deworming of 16,232 school children in Bor South County.

Situation Update

- The 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence Campaign takes place from 25 November to 10 December 2017. The 'Orange Campaign' as it is informally called is part of the Secretary General's [UNITE](#) campaign, with this year's theme focusing on "Leaving No One Behind". The campaign emphasizes the importance of working for a world free from gender-based violence, while reaching the most underserved and marginalized persons, including refugees, migrants, minorities, indigenous peoples, and populations affected by conflict and natural disasters, amongst others, first. WFP says no to gender-based violence.

WFP Response



Food and Nutrition Assistance

- WFP and partners have assisted a total 16,700 people facing Humanitarian Catastrophe (IPC Phase 5) in Baggari region southwest of Wau in Western Bahr el Ghazal State. Humanitarian partners provided life-saving food, nutrition services, health care, household items, hygiene and sanitation assistance. Baggari was of great concern according to the latest Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) with 10 percent of its population of 25,000 in Catastrophe due to insecurity, sporadic humanitarian access since 2016, a lack of freedom of movement and a loss of livelihoods. The last humanitarian response by WFP and partners in that area, assisting 16,600 people, was in mid-September 2017.
- Last week WFP school meals team completed the baseline assessment and deworming activities in new schools in Bor South County. WFP visited a total of 38 schools, including 16 new schools, and dewormed 16,232 school children. In addition, WFP conducted trainings on food management and record keeping in 18

schools with a total of 72 participants. Since the beginning of the year, WFP supported 626 schools across the country, assisting a total of 252,000 school children. WFP also supports school gardening as part of the curriculum. School gardens complement the school feeding programme due to its production of fresh vegetables and fruit (when available) and learning potential for children.

- Currently there are 6 integrated rapid response mechanism (IRRM) teams deployed in Jonglei, Unity and Upper Nile States, providing life-saving food and nutrition assistance to about 92,760 people, including 17,500 children under the age of five. WFP plans to deploy an additional 25 missions in the coming six weeks, assisting 480,000 people.



Supply Chain

- The first WFP convoy of 19 trucks, carrying 500mt of cereals departed El Obeid (Sudan) on 21 November and is currently on its way to Aweil (South Sudan). Opening the fourth corridor from Sudan to South Sudan allows WFP to augment its food delivery requirement to assist people in Greater northern Bahr el Ghazal region. Transporting food commodities through this corridor, from El-Obeid in Sudan over Kordofan to Aweil in South Sudan, allows WFP to deliver humanitarian assistance faster and more cost efficient compared to its southern corridors from Kenya and Uganda. Moreover, moving food into northern parts of South Sudan gives WFP up to one and a half months longer to preposition food ahead of the rainy season which makes southern parts of the country inaccessible starting in June. In addition to this newly opened corridor, WFP also uses another route from El-Obeid to Aweil, the El-Obeid-Bentiu corridor and the Kosti-Renk corridor from Sudan to South Sudan.
- WFP continues to deliver food and nutrition commodities by all means possible– by road, air and river– across South Sudan. So far this year, WFP has dispatched a total of 258,000mt of food commodities.

Clusters and Common Services



Food Security & Livelihoods Cluster

- FSL cluster held a livestock working group meeting on 23 November which highlighted the discussion on accountability in livestock programming, partner's role to ensure quality service delivery in line with the national standards, and engagement of relevant stakeholders prior to livestock interventions.



Logistics Cluster

- In the past week, the Logistics Cluster facilitated the delivery of 123 mt of cargo to multiple destinations including Akobo, Chuil, Duk Padiet, Gum, Haat, Jikmir, Karam, Kiechkon, Kurwai, Mabior, Menime, New Fangak, Nyal, Pajut, Paloich,

Pathai, Pieri, Pulchuol and Yambio on behalf of 15 organizations.

- The Logistics Cluster in collaboration with RedR UK successfully conducted logistics trainings in field emergencies. Since October this year, 124 participants from 24 humanitarian organizations have been trained in basic logistics including warehouse management and inventory control.
- The Logistics Cluster is engaging the humanitarian community on dry season planning for 2018; the cluster will coordinate interagency convoys to support this exercise. Last week, the cluster participated in the Civil Military Advisory Group (CMAG) meeting where dry season plans were discussed with relevant stakeholders.

UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS)

- During the week, UNHAS transported 2,086 passengers and 36.2mt light humanitarian cargo to 63 destinations across South Sudan. In addition, WFP Aviation performed 45 airdrop flights, dropping 1,214mt of WFP food commodities.
- UNHAS performed 2 security relocations of 23 passengers on behalf of from Dablual and Leer in Unity State, on behalf of 2 organisations. One medical evacuation patient was transported from Maban to Juba.
- In support of the Inter-Cluster Working Group (ICWG) Rapid Response Mission (ICRM) mechanism, UNHAS transported eight (8) passengers from IOM and PAH from Pulchuol and Pathai to Juba.
- UNHAS performed charters on behalf of UNDP and UNICEF to/from Yambio. Also, charters for ICRC and UNICEF were performed to Touch Riak, Rumbek and Aweil with 8.7 mt cargo.
