Situation Update

- Round 21 of the Food Security and Nutrition Monitoring System (FSNMS) survey is currently being conducted by WFP, FAO, Unicef, the National Bureau of Statistics and other partners. This survey is interviewing about 8,250 households across the country which allows for geographically representative food security data.
- Last week, Ms. Jane Connors the United Nations Victims' Rights Advocate on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse visited South Sudan. WFP Sub-Offices in Malakal, Bor, Juba and technical units participated in meetings, discussions and consultations that focused on highlighting the key aspects of the Secretary General's strategy in addressing sexual exploitation and abuse (SEA) especially in relation to assistance to victims and the launching of community based complaints mechanisms. WFP is an active participant of the PSEA taskforce, sharing information on the number of partners and WFP staff trained on PSEA, training tools and resources and lessons learnt of the WFP complaints and feedback mechanism (CFM).
- WFP participated in a high level UN agency and donor mission to Aweil from 7 to 8 December. Participants included WFP, UNICEF, UNDP, FAO, OCHA, UNMISS Deputy Special Representative of the Secretary General (DSRSG) as well as representatives of Japan, UK, Germany, Norway, Sweden, and the Netherlands. The objective of the mission was to visit the progress of the WFP, FAO, UNICEF, UNDP Joint Recovery and Stabilization Programme in Northern Bahr el Ghazal and to highlight inter-agency efforts to develop synergies across interventions. Over two days, the delegation visited joint programme sites including a vocational training centre established by UNDP which WFP is supporting through food for training and a UNICEF/WFP supported nutrition centre, among others. The delegation also met with the local government authorities from the Greater Northern Bahr el Ghazal region.



WFP Response



Food and Nutrition Assistance

- Currently there are 17 integrated rapid response mechanism (IRRM) teams deployed in Jonglei, Unity and Upper Nile States, conducting head count activities and providing life-saving food and nutrition assistance to about 330,500 people, including 61,300 children under the age of five. WFP plans to deploy an additional 20 missions in the coming six weeks, assisting 42,700 people.
- IRRM teams are currently conducting headcount and registrations in six Nassir County locations including madding, Maker, Makak, Ngueny, Mandeng and Jikmir. In addition, IRRM teams have been deployed to conduct food distributions in Aburoc, Atar 3/Diel, Luil and Kaikuny.



Supply Chain

- WFP continues to deliver food and nutrition commodities by all means possible– by road, air and river– across South Sudan. So far this year, WFP has dispatched a total of 265,000mt of food commodities.
- Over the past week, WFP convoys transported food commodities from Juba to Rumbek, Bor, Mingkaman and Kapoeta.

Clusters and Common Services



Food Security & Livelihoods Cluster

- The FSL cluster coordinator joined a mission comprising a group of 15 donors and UN agency colleagues from WFP, FAO, UNICEF and UNDP in support of a multi-sector and multi-annual joint programme to address the food security, nutrition and deteriorating livelihood situation across Northern Bahr El Ghazal State.
- On 7 December the Livestock Working Group held a meeting to discuss holistic livestock programming and leveraging on existing pipeline supplies. Partners are to design activities which focus on installation and maintenance of cold chain facilities, capacity building of existing/new Community Animal Health Worker (CAHW) teams and equipping them with relevant drugs, supplies and equipment and enhance coordination with counterpart agencies to complement projects.



Logistics Cluster

- In the past week, the Logistics Cluster facilitated the delivery of 153mt of cargo to Aburoc, Akobo, Buong, DinDin, Ganyiel, Jikmir, Karam, Lankien, Mading, Mandeng, New Fangak, Ngweny, Nyal, Ulang, Wiechjol and Yuai on behalf of 15 organizations.
- On 2 December, the Logistics Cluster coordinated a convoy to Yei carrying multisector cargo, on behalf of Plan International, UNICEF, IOM and UNHCR.
- Loading of the NFI barge sets has been successfully completed in Bor and are expected in

Malakal in the coming weeks. This will mark the 3rd barge movement of 2017 coordinated by the cluster.

UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS)

- During the week, UNHAS transported 2,286 passengers and 26.1 mt light humanitarian cargo to 85 destinations in South Sudan. WFP Aviation performed 71 flights, air dropping 1,886 MT of food commodities.
- UNHAS facilitated two medical evacuations on behalf of two UNHCR and INTERSOS from Ajuong Thok and Wiechjol, respectively.
- UNHAS performed a charter on behalf of UNHCR to/from Maban, facilitating Her Royal Highness Princess Sara Zeid of Jordan and other VIP passengers.
- UNHAS performed a charter on behalf of UNDP to/from Aweil, supporting a high-level joint mission of Heads of UN Agencies and the Humanitarian Coordinator. UNHAS also performed two charters on behalf of WHO from Juba/Yambio to/from Maridi.
- UNHAS facilitated an urgent Inter-Agency Mission to Duk Poktap and Duk Payuel, transporting 16 passengers from FAO, IMC, INTERSOS, NRC, UNDSS, UNHCR, UNICEF, UNOCHA, WFP, and WHO.
- To ensure sufficient capacity to respond to the pre-holiday demand, UNHAS added a DHC 8-400 to its fleet.
- On Wednesday, UNHAS conducted its Aviation-Emergency Response Exercise (Desktop Exercise) with a simulated drill of an emergency situation.
