Discussion Paper: Preserving Humanitarian Space while Transcending the Humanitarian/Development Divide (Norwegian Refugee Council)



The most prevalent operational reality of WFP and NGOs is protracted conflict. When multi-mandated actors deepen partnerships with governments and tap into development funding – the preservation of humanitarian space can be brought into question. Close partnership with governments – supporting national development plans - could affect access, partnerships, advocacy and protection. How does this dilemma manifest itself in contemporary operations, and how can we mitigate any negative consequences?

Understand how different actors approach this issue, learn from best practice in operationalizing humanitarian principles, and review ways of mitigating negative impact on humanitarian space.
