She has covered a number of health related issues including AIDS in China, SARS, the food crisis in North Korea, avian influenza, and genetically modified crops.

She has won numerous awards including the annual award from the Society of Publishers in Asia (for avian influenza reporting) and the Asia Society Osborn Elliott Prize (for reporting on AIDS in China).

Elisabeth Rosenthal has a B.A. from Stanford University and an M.D. from Harvard University. She trained in internal medicine at New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center.
