Situation Update

- WFP is gradually expanding the implementation of its South Sudan Accountability to Affected Populations (AAP) Complaint and Feedback Mechanism (CFM) throughout the country to enhance two-way communication between WFP and the communities it serves and to take the appropriate measures on the issues raised. The three-month pilot CFM project, which includes helpdesks and a hotline, was officially launched in January 2017. It targeted cash-based transfer (CBT) locations in Juba, Mingkaman and Aweil. The majority of feedback and complaints (71-93 percent) received were from women aged 26-45 years and were related to registrations, information on entitlements, and the implementation of SCOPE. This feedback allowed WFP to coordinate with relevant stakeholders to discuss and identify possible solutions as well as strengthening its existing programme. Based on this successful pilot, WFP plans to expand its CFM from July to November to Malakal, Bentiu, Maban, Bor, Wunrok, Torit and Kaopoeta.
- This year's National Girls Education Day under the motto "Let all girls go to school", organized by the Ministry of Education, took place on 18 July in Bentiu, Unity State. The National Girls' Education Day is an annual event intended to raise awareness and promote girls' right to education. In South Sudan numerous barriers still exist that prevent girls from fully participating in the education system. WFP addresses the issue of low enrolment of girls in schools through an incentive in the form of a takehome ration to families that keep their girls enrolled in school. In June alone, WFP has assisted 180,000 school children, including 85,600 girls, across the country through its school meals programme.

WFP Response



Food and Nutrition Assistance

- Currently, there are 11 integrated rapid response mission (IRRM) teams deployed in Unity, Jonglei and Upper Nile states, providing life-saving food and nutrition assistance to about 200,000 people, including 40,400 children under the age of 5. WFP plans to deploy an additional 26 missions in the coming six weeks, assisting approximately 435,037 people.
- Over the past week, IRRM teams completed registrations in Taam in Unity State as well as in Wan and Buot in Jonglei State. In addition, IRRM teams completed deliveries to Nyal in Unity State, to Nyanapol, Old Fangak, Lankien, Chuil in Jonglei State and to Udier, Mandeng, Riang and Aburoc in Upper Nile State.







Supply Chain

- Despite heavy and continuous rainfall across the country which makes most of the main routes difficult to access or impassable, WFP continues to deliver food and nutrition commodities by all means possible- by road, air and river- across South Sudan. WFP has dispatched over 204,000 mt of food since the beginning of this year.
- Over the past week, WFP transported a total of 911mt of food commodities to Yei, Gorom, Mahad and the protection of civilian (POC) sites in Juba. A convoy of 27 trucks carrying 1,021mt of commodities in on its way to Bor.

Clusters and Common Services



Food Security & Livelihoods Cluster

• The FSL cluster coordinator visited the sub national FSL cluster in Bor to conduct a context analysis to assess the degree of integration in inter-agency and inter-cluster humanitarian response and to determine the level of programme transition towards early recovery and resilience as well as to understand the scale and support of the emergency response from the Bor based humanitarian actors to the Jonglei response.



Logistics Cluster

• In the past week, the Logistics Cluster facilitated the delivery of 148 mt of cargo to 19 locations (Aburoc, Bor, Ganyiel, Gorwai, Juaibor, Koch, Lankien, Leer, New Fangak, Nyal, Old Fangak, Pagil, Paguer, Pibor, Thaker, Touch Riak, Ulang and Wechuol) on behalf of 22 organizations. This includes 35mt of relief supplies to central Unity

- State and 4 mt of WASH, health, nutrition, operational support and protection cargo to support a UNICEF rapid response mission in Paquer.
- The Logistics Cluster coordinated a convoy from Juba to Torit on behalf of four humanitarian organisations. The next Logistics Cluster coordinated convoy is expected to depart Juba on 3 August to Rumbek and Wau.

UN Humanitarian Air Service (UNHAS)

- During the week, UNHAS transported 2,037 passengers and 24.6mt of light humanitarian cargo to 57 destinations. UNHAS performed 60 WFP airdrop flights, dropping a total of 1,422 mt of food commodities.
- UNHAS performed five medical evacuations from Aweil, Yambio, Maban, and Yida on behalf of three humanitarian organizations.
- UNHAS supported an Inter-Cluster Working Group (ICWG) Rapid Response Mission (ICRM) from Juba to Gumruk and Likuangole, transporting seven passengers from three NGOs. In addition, on Saturday, UNHAS performed a charter flight on behalf of UNHCR, transporting 41 passengers from Juba to Yida.
- Despite rainy season conditions, UNHAS recorded only two cancellations due to rain this week.



Feeder Roads

• A contract has been signed in mid-July for the works on an approach road to Kuajok Bridge, Warrap State. The bridge will enable a road connection between Kuajok and Lunyaker towns, separated by a river, in an area with high agricultural potential. This week, preparations for the construction have started.
