- Promote behaviour change and increase awareness on nutritious food.
- Establish effective early warning system.
- Strengthen national capacities in forecasting and generate real time assessment of crop quality.
- Strengthen institutions through improved coordination.
- Promote social protection.

Refugees and other crisis affected people in Uganda have access to adequate nutritious food in times of crisis Food insecure populations in areas affected by recurring climate shocks have access to adequate and nutritious food all year. PLW and children <5 in areas of the country vulnerable to acute food insecurity have acute malnutrition rates and stunting rate trends in line with national and global targets by 2030

Smallholder farmers, especially women, in targeted areas have strengthened and resilient livelihoods by 2030 National and subnational institutions in Uganda have increased capacity to coordinate and manage food security and nutrition programmes, and respond to shocks by 2030

The Humanitarian community in Uganda and neighboring countries has access to cost-efficient, agile supply chain services when needed
